Exhibitor Information

- Entry forms for the NJBS heifer, cow/calf, and bred and owned shows as well as the Futurity show are located in this packet. Please make sure that all requested information is given and that the rules for exhibiting are understood.
- **THE ENTRY & MEMBERSHIP DEADLINE IS JUNE 1ST -- ALL ENTRIES MUST BE POSTMARKED NO LATER THAN JUNE 1ST & YOU MUST BE A PAID ACTIVE MEMBER BY JUNE 1ST TO PARTICIPATE IN ALL CONTESTS!** (Absolutely no refunds after this date...NO EXCEPTIONS!!)
- Each entry requires a \$35 fee. Heifers shown in both the bred & owned and the owned heifer show require two (2) entry fees. Futurity Show entries are \$60 each.
- Completed forms along with your payment should be sent to: IBBA, c/o Mary Douglass, P.O. Box 696020 78269. Checks payable to NJBS/Futurity.
- **ABSOLUTELY NO LATE ENTRIES OR SUBSTITUTIONS WILL BE ACCEPTED AFTER JUNE 1ST...NO EXCEPTIONS!**
- **REMEMBER ALL PAPERWORK (REGISTRATIONS AND TRANSFERS) MUST BE COMPLETED BEFORE JUNE 1ST TO BE ELIGIBLE TO SHOW!** Call the registration department (210/696-4343) if you have not received your paperwork prior to submitting entries or two weeks prior to June 1st.

OWNERSHIP REQUIREMENTS

All entries must be in the sole ownership of the junior exhibitor no later than **MAY 18, 2009** (60 days prior to show date). Entries must be recorded in the sole ownership name of one junior only with the exception of bred and owned bulls. No heifer or cow/calf partnership entries will be accepted. (See Show Eligibility Guidelines)

ELIGIBILITY

Exhibitors must be paid members of the International Junior Brangus Breeders Assn. (IJBBA) between the ages of 7 and 21 without having had their 22nd birthday by January 1, 2009, to be eligible to exhibit AND to participate in all NJBS contests. YOU MUST BE A PAID ACTIVE MEMBER BY JUNE 1ST TO BE ELIGIBLE TO COMPETE IN NJBS ACTIVITIES!! If you have not renewed this year's membership, you need to submit the \$25 fee and membership application prior to, or at time of entry noting such.

EXHIBITION

Animals must be shown by the individual in whose name the animal is registered. The only exceptions shall be if an individual has two animals entered in the same class, or in case of an emergency which occurred after arrival of the youth and animal to the show, or if prior approval has been given by the IJBBA executive committee. Do not request alternate exhibitors for any extracurricular reasons. All exhibitors agree to allow their entries to be used as demonstration animals if requested to do so by Association officials.

ARRIVAL/RELEASE OF CATTLE

Cattle will be allowed in the barn beginning at 8:00 a.m. Sunday, July 12. All NJBS cattle must be in place by 12:00 noon Monday, July 13. Open Futurity Show cattle (only) must be in place by 12:00 noon Thursday, July 16. Cattle will be released as they complete showing and must be out of barns by midnight on Saturday, but can stay in tie outs until Sunday morning. **NO TACK OR CATTLE WILL BE ALLOWED IN THE BARN UNTIL SUNDAY MORNING.**

TIE-OUTS AND BEDDING

Pine shavings will be the designated bedding allowed in the barn. You will have **limited** shavings in your stall upon arrival. **No outside shavings will be allowed.** Shavings will be available for purchase \$7/bag. Tie-out space will be available in a large open-sided barn where straw may be used as bedding. Trailers will be accessible for tying out cattle. If you have panels, you are welcome to bring them for setting up tie-out stalls in the designated areas. All animals must be in the barn during the day. See schedule for times.

SHOW ATTIRE

Show harnesses will be required to be worn by each exhibitor with numbers worn in the front of the harness. Exhibitors are required to wear an NJBS shirt while exhibiting in the owned heifer show, Thursday, July 16. Each exhibitor will be provided a shirt at time of check-in (please designate size on entry form). Additional shirts may be purchased at the show. **All futurity exhibitors must wear a collared shirt in the show ring.**

LIABILITY

Persons making entries in the show shall agree to abide by all the rules and regulations of the IBBA. All entries will be under the control and direction of the show superintendents. The International Brangus Breeders Association will not be responsible for loss, injury or damage done to, or occasioned by, or arising from, any animal or article exhibited by a junior. The exhibitor shall indemnify the above associations against all legal or other proceeding in regard thereto, as well as damage or injury to any other person or property, caused by the exhibitor of any of the animals exhibited with such exhibitor or any of the animals exhibited.

HEALTH AND REGISTRATION PAPERS

Current health certificates and registration papers will be required on all cattle. Fertility examination papers are required on all bulls 15 months and older. For more information on health requirements, contact your local veterinarian. Registration and health papers will be viewed during cattle check-in.

PREMIUMS

Premiums will be offered in the NJBS Bred Shows, Cow/Calf Show, Heifer Show and open Futurity Show. Added premiums will be given to bred and owned entries enrolled in BHIR with all applicable information provided. Proof of enrollment will be verified at time entry is made. Premiums will be distributed as soon as all show expenses have been paid and each exhibitor has written the specified thank you notes to NJBS sponsors and donors (from list in exhibitor's show packet) and has sent them addressed and stamped to Samantha prior to the stated deadline. **Thank you notes received that are not stamped will be returned to the exhibitor! Exhibitors forfeit premiums if thank you notes are not received by deadline stated.**

BREEDING SHOW CLASSIFICATIONS

The National Junior Brangus Show and open Futurity Show individual classes will be made up and divided after the cattle are checked in. They will be judged from youngest to oldest. A breakdown of the divisions by age as well as current IBBA show rules and regulations are located in this booklet.

CAMPER FACILITIES

Camper (RV) space will be available for \$15/night on the grounds

SHOW SUPPLIES / FEED

There will be a show supply trailer available for your show supply needs. A local feed dealer will also be available for your convenience.

2009-2010 IBBA Special Show Rules and Regulations

VERY IMPORTANT...PLEASE READ CAREFULLY!

1. Animals must be registered in the International Brangus Breeders Association (IBBA) to be eligible to compete in an IBBA-sponsored show. Animals recorded in the IBBA appendix registry are disqualified. The registration certificate (or photocopy) for each entry must be available for presentation to the Superintendent or show manager at the time entries are verified prior to judging.
2. The IBBA, and its representatives, have the authority to require such tests as they deem necessary to verify the accuracy of the classification and pedigree of exhibited Brangus animals. Said authority shall extend to, and cover the enforcement of, all show rules as adopted by the IBBA.
3. The registration number, permanent animal identification number (brand or tattoo), birth date and sire of each animal entered in an individual class must be listed on the entry form.
4. Animals eligible to be shown in group classes must be entered and shown in respective individual classes. Cows exhibited in the cow/calf classes are not eligible for the group classes.
5. Prior to check-in, heads of breeding animals must be clipped of all hair (including topknots) and be free of scurs and/or slick spots.
6. Any animal found to have scurs and/or slick spots, or evidence of incisions, surgical or otherwise, in the following areas: head, testicles, sheath, navel or dewlap, will be disqualified from showing. Animals with illegal white (white in front of the navel) or any indication of brindling (a color pattern characterized by red streaks mingled with black) are ineligible for show. Any animal upon check in which does not have a legible tattoo or brand corresponding to its registration certificate is ineligible to show. Once disqualified due to incorrect or illegible tattoo/brand, animals cannot be re-tattooed and rechecked at show. The brand/tattoo can be corrected and re-checked at the next available show.
7. Any Brangus animal recorded in the IBBA registry that has a "Parentage Dispute" listed in its first three-generation pedigree is ineligible for participation in Brangus shows and exhibitions. If the dispute is resolved, the listing will be removed from the pedigree and show eligibility will be restored.
8. In IBBA sanctioned shows, no animal may be shown that has been artificially filled with any amount of liquid at any time once the animal enters the grounds of a show. The fitter or ranch entity involved with an animal being artificially filled will be banned from the show ring for one year and the animal will be disqualified from exhibition at that particular show. The official show veterinarian may administer liquids orally, if so needed without disqualifying animal(s) from exhibition.
9. No animal may be shown that has had any foreign objects glued to or otherwise attached in a manner so as to alter its conformation or change its appearance. Animals unethically fitted to alter the conformation or appearance of the animal will be disqualified. Tail ties and hair nets used on the tail and switch are the only exceptions.
10. All Brangus bulls 15 months of age or older that are exhibited at IBBA sponsored shows must have passed a fertility examination given by a licensed veterinarian to be eligible to show. The results of the examination must be available at check-in. Once a bull has a positive examination, retesting is not required.
11. All females 20 months of age or older exhibited at IBBA sanctioned shows, must have available at the time of check-in, a certificate of pregnancy issued by an accredited, non-owner veterinarian, or blood test results certificate. If the female is open due to being in an embryo transfer program, this fact must be verified in a written statement by a non-owner embryologist. If verification cannot be produced, the female may be allowed to participate if the exhibitor can produce a qualified veterinarian to examine the female at the show site and verify pregnancy.
12. Entries that have not complied with all of the above rules will not be eligible to show, to receive premium monies, or earn points in the IBBA's Show Sire of the Year, Show Bull of the Year, and Show Heifer of the Year awards.
13. All IBBA and IJBBA member will abide by the show rules as adopted. In addition, any show, fair, event or display in which Brangus cattle participate should follow these rules as adopted by IBBA. All Brangus entries are subject to the provision of a rule of the IBBA enti-

2009-2010 Inspection of Exhibits

VERY IMPORTANT...PLEASE READ CAREFULLY!

1. The IBBA and its representative have the authority to require such tests as they deem necessary to verify the accuracy of the classification and pedigree of exhibited Brangus animals. Said authority shall extend to and cover the enforcement of all show rules as adopted by IBBA.
2. Each exhibitor shall submit his or her registered Brangus cattle to such tests and examinations as requested and/or required by the IBBA, its authorized representatives, or those of the relevant show.
3. For and in consideration of the opportunity to participate in any Brangus function each exhibitor hereby releases the Association, its officers, directors and representatives from negligence, any and all claims, suits, and judgements past, present, or future, arising from or connected with the administration or use of such test or examination and the resulting decision there from.
4. Dental Inspection: All entries may be classified for judging on an age basis and should be entered in class according to age. Teeth may be inspected by a veterinarian designated by the I.B.B.A. in order to determine whether dental development is within allowable limits for the class so entered. If the veterinarian determines that in his opinion dental development exceeds maximum allowable limits, the animal shall be moved to an older class as determined by the veterinarian and shall remain in that class until determined otherwise by subsequent mouthing or favorable appeal to the Executive Committee. If it is not possible to move an animal, the animal may not be exhibited in such show.
5. Any exhibitor desiring to dispute or challenge the results of any such test, exam, or show rule enforcement, as applied to his animals, shall do so in accordance with procedures established by the rules of the IBBA.
6. Appeal: An appeal from the decision of the veterinarian or designated association representatives designated by the I.B.B.A. under sections 1 and 4 of the Inspection of Exhibits may be made to the Executive Committee of the IBBA if the following requirements are satisfied: 1) the appeal is in writing and is signed by the appealing party; and 2) the appealing party files the written appeal with the IBBA Executive Committee as soon as possible after the veterinarian's or designated association representative's decision is rendered and in any event within six (6) hours of the time the veterinarian's or designated association representative's decision was made. If an appeal satisfying the foregoing requirements is filed with the IBBA Executive Committee, the Executive Committee shall hold a hearing at which the appealing party and the veterinarian or designated association representatives whose decision is being appealed shall present statements and other evidence that are relevant to the matter, following which the Executive Committee shall render a decision which shall be final and conclusive.

IBBA Blood Typing for Parentage Verification

Each Brangus animal for which an entry application or registration is received may be subjected to a DNA genotyping test in order to verify both accuracy of parentage and DNA/blood type, according to Rules 1 and 2 of the International Brangus Breeders Association (IBBA) Inspection of Exhibits. At selected shows and fairs, blood samples will be taken from all division champions and reserve division champions for the purpose of verifying parentage and DNA/blood type. Staff or representative of IBBA will supervise the collection of blood samples which can be taken at shows, fairs and events where IBBA contributes premium money or where IBBA staff personnel participate. Cost of the DNA/blood typing procedure will be paid for by IBBA. If a recorded parent is excluded (as a parent) as a result of DNA/blood typing, the owner of the animal may request, at his or her own expense, further determination of the actual parent. Failure to determine the sire and dam will result in the animal being listed in the IBBA Registry as a "Parentage Dispute," and the animal will be ineligible for future shows and exhibitions.

Queen and Officer Candidates!

International Brangus Queen Candidates

Contestants must be present at the National Junior Brangus Show to compete. Candidates must be a current member of the IJBBA and must be at least 16 years of age and not have reached her 21st birthday by the day of election. Judging of queen contestants will be on the basis of (1) appearance, (2) personality, (3) poise, (4) intelligence, (5) speaking ability and (6) basic knowledge of Brangus. Each contestant should prepare a scrapbook which includes photos and clippings of any activities for which she is or has been involved (school, church, 4-H, FFA or Brangus). For individual interviews, contestants should dress appropriately. Contestants will also be asked to give a prepared speech at the opening ceremonies about why they want to be the IBBA Queen. Contestants will also be responsible for working the silent auction throughout the week and supplying an auction item, because all proceeds go to the Queen's travel fund. Applications must be postmarked no later than June 1st. Prior to the general membership meeting all applicants will be interviewed by the advisors, IJBBA president and IJBBA ex-officio. Only those individuals who have completed the above said application by the stated deadline will be allowed to be nominated from the floor during the election. Director candidates must be present during the National Junior Brangus Show and IJBBA Annual General Membership Meeting.

2009 Champions Challenge Show

All heifers from the 2008 Source of Champions Sale are eligible to compete in the Champion's Challenge Show. This show will take place before the Bred and Owned Show. This show has its own entry fee of \$35, noted on the entry form, and will be a jackpot show with monetary prizes totaling \$1000. Because of the limited age range of last year's sale heifers there will only be one class. This show will continue and all of this year's SOC sale heifers will be eligible for the 2010 Challenge. Mandatory Family Meal/Activity Fee

Barnyard Olympics

There will be 4 timed events and the traditional pie eating contest. There will be teams of eight people that will need a name. The teams can be people of any age group or variation. Contests and events are subject to change.

Events: "Pie Eating Contest"—Contest will last until first person gets done. Pans will be nailed to the table. Pan must stay on the table and the partner will stand behind and feed the pie eater.

"The NJBS 500"—4 members are all attached to the ankle in a square. Each member holds a tire while they go around the small track. After one lap the pit stop is required where the tires are rotated. Each team will go around twice, so all the members can participate. Every team will be timed and ranked.

2009 NJBS Contest Rules

Minimum age to participate in show and/or contest activities is 7, age as of January 1, 2009. To enter these contests, please complete the form on page 7 and return with your entry information. Note rule changes with asterisk (*).

NATIONAL SKILL-A-THON CONTEST - for points in all around -

A written contest in which IJBBA members between 7 and 21 may participate. Questions will range from general Brangus to general agriculture information. Contestants will go from station to station answering the questions on their answer form. There will be different question sets for each of the three age divisions. These question sets will vary in knowledge level and skills proficiency depending upon the age division and all three age divisions will be run simultaneously. Check the schedule for date and time to be given. Winners will be selected in the three age divisions: junior (7-12), intermediate (13-16) and senior (17-21).

NATIONAL PHOTOGRAPHY CONTEST - for points in all around -

One (1) entry is allowed per contestant. Winners will be selected by judges in three age divisions: junior (7-12), intermediate (13-16) and senior (17-21). Photos must be printed on original photopaper and be 5 x 7 inch color or black & white prints matted on 8 x 10 inch black poster board--NO PHOTOCOPIES; ALL PHOTOS MUST BE PRINTED ON ORIGINAL PHOTO PAPER; ALL PHOTOS MUST BE TAKEN BY CONTESTANT IN PAST YEAR AND CANNOT HAVE BEEN PRESENTED FOR COMPETITION AT A PREVIOUS NJBS. The entry form on page 8 should be typed and affixed to the back side, upper left-hand corner of entry. **PHOTOS MUST BE ORIGINALS**, must include Brangus, and cannot be altered or image-enhanced in any way. **JUNIORS MUST BE THE SOLE PHOTOGRAPHER**. Division winning photographs become the property of the IBBA/BPI upon entering the contest. Photos must be turned in at contest check-in.

NATIONAL COMPUTER-GENERATED BRANGUS ADVERTISEMENT - for participation points in all around -

Only one (1) entry per contestant. Winners will be selected by judges in three age divisions: junior (7-12), intermediate (13-16), and senior (17-21). Advertisements should be 8.5" x 11", which is one-full sheet of paper, no folds. **Ads should center around promoting the Brangus breed**. Contestants' entries will be evaluated for their originality, neatness, and the message conveyed. The entire advertisement must be computer generated. It can be in color or black and white, and will not be counted off if color is not used. The entry form on page 8 should be typed and affixed to the backside of the entry. Advertisements must be turned in during contest check-in. **JUNIORS MUST BE THE SOLE DESIGNER**.

NATIONAL SALESMANSHIP CONTEST - for points in all around -

This competition allows teams of three to present and sharpen their skills and abilities to market Brangus by "selling" an animal to a moderator. There will be two divisions: 7-13 (junior) and 14-21 (senior). All three team members must be in the same age division. The contest is controlled by a moderator and evaluated by a panel of judges. Each team will be assigned an animal, a sale scenario along with pedigree and performance information. Teams will be given a preparation time before their selling spot. Business cards, brochures, and promotional materials on their imaginary sales company is encouraged by all, but not mandatory.

NATIONAL PUBLIC SPEAKING CONTEST - for points in all around -

The contest entry form on page 8 must be filled out and returned for all speech contestants. Three divisions will be offered to all current IJBBA members. They include junior (7-12), intermediate (13-16) and senior (17-21). Junior and intermediate contestants will be required to bring four typewritten, double-spaced copies of their speech (with bibliography) on 8 1/2" x 11" white paper to contest check-in. **No visual aids of any kind will be allowed, just the junior and their note cards. The speech cannot have been presented for competition at previous NJBS events.**

The topic for the junior division can be any aspect concerning Brangus cattle or the beef industry. The intermediate topic is anything associated with "Soil and Water Management...and How It Determines Our Future in the Beef Industry". All speeches must pertain to the described topic or the contestant will be disqualified. No minimum time limit is applied to juniors or intermediates, but there is a maximum limit of six minutes. The senior public speaking contest is an impromptu speech format where contestants will choose a topic at random and then be given information for that topic to research and write their speech. This section will be timed and each contestant will be given 30 minutes for preparation. At the end of that time, they will be ushered to the judging room and deliver their speech. Topics are current topics in the beef industry. The minimum time requirement for the senior level will be five minutes with a maximum of eight minutes.

Contestants will draw for order. Junior and intermediate division contestants will be permitted to use a maximum of three 3" x 5" note cards, written on only one side of each card. Contestants in the senior division will be permitted to use four 3" x 5" note cards for their speech outlines, written on only one side. Excessive reference to notes may result in deductions from his/her score.

Judges will be furnished with typewritten copies of the contestants' speeches for the younger divisions and lists of speech topics for the senior division. Each judge will be allowed to ask questions after a speech is given and contestants will be scored on their ability to answer questions. After each contestant has made his/her presentation, they will be scored on composition and delivery. A time keeper will record the time used by each contestant in delivering speech, noting under time and overtime, if any, for which deductions will be made.

2009 NJBS Contest Rules

TEAM FITTING AND SHOWING COMPETITION** *PLEASE NOTE NEW AGE GROUPS - for points in all around -*

Teams will be selected at random draw and will consist of one **junior (7-13)**, one **intermediate (14-16)**, and one **senior (17-21)** member. Intermediates will be moved up to seniors if there aren't enough seniors. The number of juniors signed up for team fitting will be the base number of teams in the competition. The entire team will be allowed to fit the animal during the timed period. After timed completion of the fitting, a brief period will be allowed for instructions on showmanship by the senior and intermediate members. After the instruction period, juniors then compete in a showmanship competition. While in the showing, the intermediate will get to accompany the junior, while the senior remains outside the ring. The intermediate will do some final instruction in the ring and then be asked to go to the other side of the arena for final showmanship evaluation. During this entire time, a panel of judges will be evaluating the teams for organization, instruction, teamwork, and their ability to fit and show the animals. The score breakdown is 40% teamwork/ organization, 25% showing, and 35% fitting. **No additional fitting BY ANY-ONE, will be allowed after the timed period is over or the team will be disqualified.** Teams are responsible for their own supplies for fitting.

NATIONAL SHOWMANSHIP CONTEST *- for points in all around -*

Competition includes four divisions: novice (7-10), junior (11-13), intermediate (14-16) and senior (17-21). Cow/calf pairs will NOT be eligible to participate unless the individual showing the calf is eligible in that age group and is competing as a separate entry. If a lactating cow is shown, the calf must not be inside the perimeter of the show ring unless there is an eligible exhibitor showing the calf as a separate entry. **No bulls will be allowed in the showmanship contest.** Animals do not have to be owned by contestants. Each contestant must be a paid IJBBA member and is responsible for securing the animal to show. Competition will not require fitting except in the senior division where finalists will be evaluated on fitting skills in addition to showmanship ability. Seniors will be responsible for their own fitting supplies. Seniors will be allowed to fit for 20 minutes and can have an IJBBA member hold the tail of the animal, which they are fitting. Questions may be asked in all divisions. Two divisions will run in each ring with only one judge.

NATIONAL QUIZ BOWL CONTEST—AKA "BRANGUS JEOPARDY" *- for participation points in all around -*

Teams consisting of four individuals will compete in answering questions pertaining to Brangus and Red Brangus and all facets of the agriculture industry. Each team must include: one junior member (7-13); one senior member (14-21); and an adult member. Teams are self selected. The fourth person must be an active IJBBA member. Both genders must be represented, and rules will be strictly enforced! It will follow a similar JEOPARDY format. There will be a mix of free for all questions, one-on-one questions, and "Double Jeopardy" with wagered team questions.

ILLUSTRATION CONTEST *- for participation points in all around -*

Only one (1) entry per contestant. There will be one division (7-21). The International Brangus Auxiliary (IBA) sponsors the Illustration contest. The winner receives a \$100 cash award the artwork becomes the property of the IBA to use at its discretion. Entries must be on white **8 x 8 in.** paper and drawn with black pen and/or pencil. **DO NOT FOLD THE PAPER!** Design should take up entire sheet. Participants should include Brangus (written or art). The contestant must be the sole creator. Entries must be turned in during contest check-in. The entry form on page 9 should be typed and affixed to back of entry.

NATIONAL SCRAPBOOK COMPETITION

All scrapbook entries must be turned in during contest check-in, and will be publicly displayed. Each state or regional association is eligible and encouraged to participate by submitting a scrapbook. Items to include: officer and membership lists, activities, shows, fundraisers and other related information. Remember a picture is worth a thousand words!

HERDSMANSHIP CONTEST

A herdsman competition will be held throughout the show that evaluates state/regional groups or individuals. There will be no divisions. All exhibitors are eligible. Scores will be accumulated and an overall winner in both divisions will be announced. Scores are based on: general appearance of cattle-neatness, cleanliness; attractiveness-signs, props, etc.; and individual participation of state or area members. Plan now to present your state's cattle to their best advantage-no matter how small or large your entry numbers are!

HIGH POINT INDIVIDUALS

Calculated by participation and ranking in all eligible activities, awards will be presented to the high point junior, intermediate and senior. Some contests are only for participation points. To win the All-Around High Point award, the contestant must participate in all contests.

BANQUET AND AWARDS PRESENTATION

The awards banquet will be Friday, July 17 at 6:00 p.m., in the Main Arena at the Ike facility. Numerous contest and special awards will be presented to hard working juniors. The evening will conclude with a slide show highlighting the past year and the NJBS. 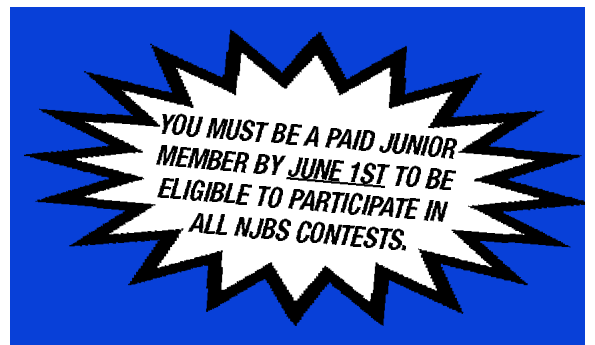
